Don't Be...

What are the first words that are actually SPOKEN in the New Testament? They are the words of the angel Gabriel, when he appeared in the temple to announce to Zacharias that he would have a son (John the Baptist). The words were: *DON'T BE AFRAID*. The same angel spoke the same greeting to the Virgin Mary six months later: *DON'T BE AFRAID*.

Those words that were spoken before Jesus was born are also the first words that are spoken in the Bible after Jesus rose from the dead:

The angel said to the women, "<u>Do not be afraid</u>, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified" (Matthew 28:5).

But then, none less than the Lord Jesus speaks those words after he has risen:

Then Jesus said to them, "<u>Do not be afraid</u>. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me" (Matthew 28:10).

DO NOT BE AFRAID – you can argue that those four words are a summary of the entire Bible. On page after page, the Lord is reminding us that in spite of all the calamities, catastrophes, and crises that darken our days, we can face them all without fear.

And Jesus' resurrection at Easter in particular shows why that is true:

- 1. Easter proves that Jesus is God. And if he is God, he certainly knows what's going on in our life and will take of us.
- 2. Easter proves that our sins have been forgiven. Jesus' resurrection shows that God accepted his death as the payment for our sins. So, we are his holy children and he loves us.
- 3. Jesus' resurrection proves that one day we will rise from the grave just as Jesus did and hear the blessed words *Come*, *you who are blessed by my Father*; *take your inheritance*, *the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world* (Matthew 25:34).

Holy Week Concert & Podcast Devotions

Lutheran Women's Missionary Society (LWMS)

(LWMS) originated in the Coulee Region more than <u>60 years ago</u>. At that time Pastor Arnold Mennicke (who served St. Matthew's in Winona for more than 50 years!) was the chairman of the Administrative Committee for Africa for the WELS Board for World Missions. Women in the area wanted to know what they could do to support WELS world missions, and he helped them found an organization to do that.

Today women from more than <u>800 WELS</u> <u>congregations</u> make up the LWMS. They comprise more than 60 "circuits" which hold spring and fall rallies which highlight both the home and world mission work which WELS carries out. Each year the LWMS raises upwards of \$100,000 to support different missions.

First Lutheran recently *rejoined* the <u>Winona circuit</u> which also has 21 other WELS congregations. The Winona Circuit's spring rally will be <u>Saturday</u>, <u>April 15</u> at St. John's in Nodine. See the announcement on the **left** for more details.

The LWMS hosts annual conventions where WELS women (and the men who love them) worship and learn about missions together. Starting this year, the annual convention will be held in La Crosse every third year.

Sue and I have been to half a dozen conventions over the years and have always left feeling uplifted and inspired. Particularly memorable are the opening and closing worship services.

This year, featured convention speakers will include **Pastor Dan Witte** from the One Africa Team (we saw a video by him on March 12), **Missionary Elise Gross** from the Latin America Team, and

Pastor Dan Lewig who recently began a new congregation in Richland Center, Wisconsin. You can check out the full schedule of activities and presentations **HERE**.

The convention will take place at the **La Crosse Center**, Thursday, June 22 – Sunday, June 25. You can register to attend the convention **HERE**. Registration is not cheap (but does include meals), but the experience will be priceless, I promise. And if you're reading this on **March 31**, you can still get the "early bird" registration discount.

Even if you don't register, do plan to come to OPENING SERVICE on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>June 22</u> at 7:00 PM. There'll likely be 3,000 in attendance singing their hearts out. You can't miss it!
