To Africa, With Love

With the permission of the Board for Lay Ministry, I've been serving as the chairman of the Administrative Committee for Africa (ACA) for the WELS Board for World Missions.

When I graduated from the seminary, serving in world missions was the furthest thing from my mind. I was shocked when we got the call to serve in Zambia. But Sue and I soon learned that we loved both living and working for the Lord in Africa. When we finally came back to the USA after 21 years, it was for two reasons: 1. for our children's education and 2. because I wanted to serve as a pastor.

But after 5 years at Immanuel Lutheran on the north side of La Crosse, I was asked to serve on the Administrative Committee for the first time, as the "liaison" for Cameroon. I was happy to volunteer my time. And during the next four years I made two trips to Cameroon, getting to know this west African country that was so different from Zambia and Malawi where we had served in Central Africa.

In 2012, the Lord surprised us again, this time with a call to live and work in India. And we pretty much figured that we'd be there until retirement. But unexpectedly the Lord saw fit to remove me from India and to bring me here to La Crescent.

I had pretty much kissed world missions goodbye when Pastor Larry Schlomer, the Administrator of the Board for World Missions called in early January and asked me to take on the chairmanship of the "AC" again.


In the last year, I've realized that a lot has changed. During my time in Central Africa, missionaries served local congregations in Zambia and Malawi. Now, that work is done by national (African) pastors. And the missionaries now work with new and old partners throughout the continent of Africa.

The annual meeting for the One Africa Team (OAT) is coming up February 13-15. And since I was going to that meeting, we decided to have Sue come along and that we would spend a little extra time in Africa. Again, there are two reasons for it: 1. We want to experience Africa once again and 2. I want to get the opportunity to sit down with the mission families in their own homes, and to experience a little bit of what day-to-day life is for them in Zambia and Malawi today.

Here's our itinerary:

- January 30 we travel down to Chicago by Amtrak and stay overnight
- January 31 we leave in the morning on Ethiopian Airlines for a 14hour (!) non-stop flight to Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.
- February 1 after a brief layover in Addis Ababa, we'll take another four-hour flight to Lilongwe, the capital of Malawi.

We have three missionaries in Lilongwe: John Roebke and his wife Nancy, Dan Kroll and his wife Karen, and Mark Panning. We lived in Lilongwe for 13 years and



are eager to see some old friends and to see how things have changed in 20 years.

February 6 – we fly from Lilongwe to Lusaka, the capital of Zambia

There are six missionaries in Lusaka: OAT team leader Howard Mohlke and his wife Leslie, John Hartmann and his wife Sharon (he's just accepted a call to serve in Tucson, AZ), Phil Birner (who will retire next year), Dan Witte and Deborah, Ben & Becky Foxen, and Keegan & Kate Dowling.

- February 7-9 we're flying down to Livingstone, Zambia by Victoria Falls this is the "vacation" part of our trip to Africa.
- February 16 we fly back to Addis Ababa, and then back to Chicago, arriving on Friday morning
 February 17 we'll board Amtrak once again and return to La Crescent.

Please keep Sue and me in your prayers.

I was downright afraid when I received the call to Africa when I graduated. When I heard the news, it was the first time in my life that I felt my jaw drop to the ground. Eight years later, my jaw dropped to the ground once more. It was in a radiologist's office when Sue was pregnant and having an ultrasound scan. That's when I heard the words, "Look, two heads, twins!" There's one thing I've learned from these jaw-dropping experiences – the Lord turns our greatest fears into his greatest blessings.

Palm Sunday, April 2 – Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.
Maundy Thursday, April 6 – Blessed are the pacemakers, for they will be called children of God.
Good Friday, April 7 – Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.
