# The Latest From WELS

On Saturday, May 14 the WELS Conference of Presidents (COP) assigned 125 graduates of Martin Luther College (MLC) to their first call teaching in WELS schools throughout the United States. There are still 140 teaching vacancies synod-wide. 48 men also graduated from MLC's pre-seminary program and will continue their studies to be pastors at Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary in the fall – nearly double the average number from the last five years. Other vacancies remain:


**St. Matthew's** in **Winona Rochester Area** – three vacancies **Good Shepherd** in **Holmen**.

# **Board For Lay Ministry Update**

- 1. **Finances** We received \$84,013 in offerings and other income. We had expenses totaling \$85,440. Therefore our deficit through these months that include Lent and Holy Week was \$1,427. We pray that our members will continue their regular support of their congregation even when they may be away on vacation during the warm weather months.
- 2. <u>Altar Area</u> last month it was announced that the top step would be removed. Someone suggested an interim idea using one of the old communion rails as a visual reminder of the awkward step. So, we're seeing how that works.
- 3. **<u>Roof Fund</u>** Total gifts to-date are \$20,024, with a \$33,000 goal. Please prayerfully consider how you can help with this project. And thanks for all your support!
- 4. **<u>Hymnal</u>** the new blue hymnals have arrived. After the new books are "conditioned," approximately half of the present red hymnal will be removed and replaced with the blue ones.
