

First Things - July 2025

Many families aren't very sure where to start with a devotional life. It can seem intimidating to start something time-consuming and complicated, especially when you have kids busy with school, sports, music, and more! Here are five simple ways to create a family life centered around God and his gospel. I hope that you can put it to use in your own family.

Attend Worship together

At church, we are served by God as he comes to us in his gospel. The life of Christ is told week after week in poetry and prose in the hymns, prayers, readings, sermon, creed, and sacrament. We stand in the very presence of God as he speaks to us, as we speak to each other, as we sing together, and as we eat and drink the meal he has prepared for us together. The worship service is designed to make use of the best of the past 2000 years of Christian worship to serve God's people with the precious gifts he has given us. Making regular church attendance a given is the number one way to receive from God on a consistent basis what he promises to give in his Word.

Read the Bible together

When you get done with a meal, read out of the Bible at the breakfast/lunch/supper table. Or if the kids get done first, have them read the story! Read from the Bible back and forth with the kids during daily devotion time. Listen to a Bible reading while you ride in the car on a long road trip. However, you choose to do it, there are many simple ways to implement Bible reading into your daily life. It doesn't have to be a half hour of reading. 2-3 minutes is all it takes to read a parable or a classic Sunday School story.

Pray together

Teach your kids to say a prayer when they wake up and when they go to bed. Say a prayer before eating every meal. Say the Lord's Prayer at devotion time. Ask if there is anyone at school who needs a prayer during supper time. Share if there's anyone in the family or at church who needs a special prayer and pray for that person. Praying together teaches your children about the central place God holds in all your lives.

Talk about the faith together

When you start praying together, reading the Bible together, attending church together, holding family devotions together, you would be amazed at how many opportunities there are for kids to ask questions about God and his Word. Don't forget to share with your kids times when you saw the way that God worked in your life or in the life of someone you know. Even the "mundane" can be a wonderful opportunity to talk about God's role: On a nature walk, driving past a homeless person, when you or a family friend has a baby, when someone gets married, and more!

Hold family devotions together

A family devotion doesn't have to involve finding the perfect book or making up difficult prayers or reading for long periods of time. Say, "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit", speak the Apostle's Creed, Pray the Lord's Prayer, read a portion of the Bible, and sing (or listen to) a Hymn– that's it! It can be accomplished in 10 minutes or less. The trick is simply to do it every day. Want to expand? Set aside a special place in the house. Light a candle. Create a family altar board (Go here to learn how: https://www.hausvater.org/articles/353). Creating the routine and sticking to it will be the most helpful way to make sure that it becomes a part of your regular life. You might be surprised as the kids will become the ones holding you accountable!
