



First Things – May 2025

Greetings dear sheep of Christ's fold,

This is a continuation of the series where I share with you some of the things that God gives you through a pastor or simply by being a member of a Christian congregation.

As Jesus prepared to ascend into heaven, some of the final words he left with his disciples, the Christian Church, were “Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them everything I have commanded you. And surely I will be with you always, to the very end of the age.” (Matthew 28:19-20) With these words, Christ gives us the blessing of the Sacrament of Holy Baptism.

Just as a reminder so that we understand all the terms being used, a “sacrament” is a sacred act that 1) Is established by God 2) uses earthly elements (such as water) together with God's Word and 3) offers, gives, and seals to us the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. Baptism is considered a sacrament because it fits all three criteria. The other sacrament that we would recognize is the Lord's Supper.

Baptism is a word which literally means “to wash with water.” And so Jesus is commanding us to engage in a washing with water through the Word (Ephesians 5:26). This act offers to us tremendous blessings. Jesus says in Mark 16:16 “Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned.” With these incredible words of our Savior, we learn that “baptism saves you” (1 Peter 3:21). You who are baptized have the assurance of knowing that you are safe from damnation for your sins, the life that Jesus has is your own, the devil has no power or right to accuse you. We rightly sing stanza 3 of God's Own Child, I Gladly Say It:

Satan, hear this proclamation: I am baptized into Christ!

Drop your ugly accusation, I am not so soon enticed.

Now that to the font I've traveled, all your might has come unraveled,

And, against your tyranny, God, my Lord, unites with me!

In this song, we get to see the beauty of baptism, that it is not simply a one-time act but it changes our status before God. We don't say “I was baptized” but “I am baptized.” And so from your church and pastor, you can expect that you will continue to be formed as a baptized child of God. This is what Luther is getting at in the Small Catechism when he teaches us to ask, “What does baptizing with water mean?” and answers:

Baptism means that the old Adam in us should be drowned by daily contrition and repentance, and that all its evil deeds and desires be put to death. It also means that a new person should daily arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

You have a new identity thanks to your baptism – child of God. With this identity, you can have no fear or shame in shoving the head of that ugly old sinful nature under the waters and killing it until it's dead. That sinful nature, that old Adam, has nothing to do with who you are now. Each morning you can awake and come before your heavenly Father and confidently ask of him as a dear child asks his dear father. For you are baptized and none of your sins from the day before are held against you. This is a daily washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. You get to have this for your entire life.

With this status then, you are able to approach each day from a different perspective. You get to step out of your bed as a child of God, his heir, and a citizen of his heavenly kingdom. Therefore, you are able to approach your tasks each day with this new status in mind. How would you approach each day if you knew without doubting that you were going to live forever? That you were richer than the richest person in the world and that you get to enter into that inheritance whenever your Lord should decide to call you home? This is the perspective that baptism affords you. You get to approach each day making it your dearest ambition and goal to use what time you've been given to serve your Lord by faithfully carrying out the tasks he has called you to; whether that be "well fed or hungry, living in plenty or in want" (Philippians 4:12), because you are the baptized.

In our recent Voters' meeting the discussion of Bible translations was brought to floor. Currently our congregation provides the New International Version 1984 translation in the pews. This translation is no longer being printed and no longer being provided digitally. This change has created the opportunity to select a new translation that we can use in worship and in print. The translations for review are the New International Version (NIV 2011), the Evangelical Heritage Version (EHV), and the English Standard Version (ESV).

To help provide insight regarding the changes between translations we will be comparing a different translation with the NIV 1984 translation each month.

May: NIV 2011 **June:** EHV **July:** ESV **August:** all three translations side by side

What will this look like? You will find the translations printed for you in your Worship Folder for each service. Our hope is that over the course of each month you will take a moment to see some of the subtle, and potentially not-so-subtle, differences between the translations and familiarize yourself with them. Pastor Pilarski will be providing additional information and insight regarding these translations over the next few months.
