Dear friends,

Many people have been feeling this way lately: the world is a very hopeless place. After all, you just have to look around – Political tensions, racial tensions, health tensions, war, disease, floods, fires, earthquakes, crime, anger, hate, and the list goes on endlessly, doesn't it? And when we think of things in these terms, it's very easy to lose hope, isn't it?

Christians, however, though we feel the weight of these burdens in the world, have a hope that no one else in the world gets to have, a hope that is not like the blind hope of "I hope it will all work out!" but a hope that will not disappoint. Christians have borne up under sufferings and persecutions since the earliest days of the Christian Church and continue to do so today, all the while following God's Word that says, "as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people." Why? Why bother? After all these years and all the evil things that have happened, why do Christians continue to have hope? Simply put, the answer is Jesus.

See, Christians understand that this world is corrupt. The evil we see around, while alarming and disturbing, is not surprising to Christians. We know that there is a reason that the world is the way it is and we know that that reason lives within ourselves: sin. Evil lives within every one of us and each person is perfectly capable of the gravest acts of evil. The only thing holding us back from utter chaos is God's grace and a self-serving self-preservation.

But that's not what gives Christians hope. What gives the Christian hope, again, is Jesus: God's answer to our failure. When God saw you and me at our most evil moment, completely lost in our sin, he had mercy. He sent Jesus, his only Son, to die the death we deserved, yes, hell. Jesus suffered hell in your place and mine. And then, because Jesus had no sin, he rose from the dead. His resurrection from the dead is the Christian's hope. Jesus' life is what let's Christians know that God still loves them. And he loves you too. Even though you didn't ask for it, even though you didn't deserve it, God still sent his Son to live, die, and rise for you.

The Christian's hope is based in historical fact: Jesus lives. And if Jesus rose from the dead, then we can hope in the face of all the hopeless things of this world because along with Jesus' resurrection is a promise. Jesus said "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me will live, even though he dies. And whoever lives and believes in me will never die." Those might be words that had a nice sentiment from any old religious teacher. However, from someone who died, was in the grave for three days, and then rose from the dead, those words take on a whole new meaning, don't they? Now they're words you can trust. Now he has

become someone you can believe in. Why do Christians carry on with hope even when the world seems hopeless? It's because when things looked hopeless for Jesus, he defeated death. Now alive, he promises that your sins are forgiven and that because he lives, you will live forever with him too.
